A frantic round of phone calls produced one replacement, Steve Woodhouse (thanks Steve!) but no more, so unfortunately the captain had to play (unfortunately for him if you see the results!). After this, apart from a slight scare when Graham Waddingham was late, the match got under way smoothly.

As for the match itself the result was never in doubt with several quick wins giving Notts. a 4-1 lead by tea. Tony Dempsey's first game for Notts. was a dour struggle which was sent for adjudication with only slight chances for a win. Graham Waddingham was always under pressure from the current British Under-21 champion whilst Dave Marchant won his first county game by a typical Queen's Gambit minority attack.

Two games from the match: the first my game (even though I lost) which shows the consequences of a slight mistake in the Sicilian Dragon (19...Rec8 was better than 19...b5 although 18...b5 may have been better still). If anyone can find a better defence later please don't tell me!

The Notts. II. vs. Leics. II. match started disastrously with no fewer than four members of the home team failing to turn up without notice. Whether this acted as a spur to the team is questionable, but they then proceeded to win the actual boards played by  $9\frac{1}{2}-7\frac{1}{2}$ . However a three board default gave the match to Leicester by the closest of margins,  $10\frac{1}{2}-9\frac{1}{2}$ . What might the result have been had we played a full team?

One piece of information gleaned at the match was that beicestershire have beaten Derbyshire. Our way to the semi-finals, therefore, is in our own hands; we must defeat Lincolnshire and then Northants. in two away fixtures in the New Year. Provided all players turn up, this should not be difficult.

With regard to the question of defaulting boards, it is bad enough to default on away matches, but particularly embarrassing to default on home matches. At least three of the missing players in the Leicester match were given incorrect information as to the venue. It is suggested that all players know the home phone number of their respective team captain, as in the above instance a phone call to the captain's home would have revealed the correct venue for the match.

This tournament (organised by Nomads) was held at the Lenton Community Centre on Sunday, 30th October, and attracted a disappointing entry of only ten. However, it did result in a very close and exciting contest in which, at the end of four rounds of a 'Swiss', six players were left with chances of securing the title.
