1 Nottingham Chessforce Event

This event took place in the dining hall of the Nottingham High School for Roys on an arctic Sunday in February. The venue was good for an event of this cind, even if it was a little difficult to find the room from the main entrance. Hence the hastily chalked blackboards showing the way! Our grateful thanks are lue to the school for the use of the facilities and to the caretaker for his nelpful co-operation.

the event was divided into two sections. There were 50 entrants in the Open and 70 in the Minor. Each section was a six round Swiss with each player having 30 minutes on the clock for the whole game.

In the Open the top graded players were Colin Crouch (Durham), Brian Eley (Rotherham), Paul Kemp (Cambridge) and Allan Richmond, John Emms and Norman Lazonby (all of Nottingham). The games were in themain keenly contested and it seemed that one or two opposite coloured endings turned into positive results when a draw seemed certain. Going into the last round the top pairings, were :

Paul Kemp $(4\frac{1}{2})$ v Brian Eley $(4\frac{1}{2})$: Norman Lazonby(4) v Michael Barnes(4) and Andrew Coppin(4) v Colin Crouch(4). The top pair agreed a quick draw after a token attempt at a game thus earning thenselves a share of first prize. Interest then centred on the other two games which eventually produced wins for Colin Crouch and Norman Lazonby resulting in a 4-way tie.

The Minor produced the only player to nave a 100% score in Paul Friend of Birstal, an ingraded player who had not played competitively for six years. He seemed to have little difficulty winning his games. The top pairings for the final round were: Friend(5) v Padvis(4½) 1-0; Walker(4½) v S.Ledger(4½) 0-1; K.Rist (4) v Young(4) 1-0; Gwynne(4) v Wollerton(4) 1-0. These results left Paul Friend the clear winner.

After narrowly qualifying for this match against Staffs., who had beaten both Warwicks. and Manchester in the West Zone, it always looked to be a difficult proposition.

Our chances weren't helped by the absence of several players and when two players fell ill on the match day, it was a further blow. However special thanks are due to Jim Cundey & John Tait for playing at very short notice (5 minutes in John's case!), and to Geoff Gibson, who was ill, for lending his car to Tony Wright.

In the end we arrived on time, with 19 players to face a team which out-graded us by approximately 20 points per board on average. Whilst we never really appeared to have a realistic hope of victory (we needed $6\frac{1}{2}$ points from the last 7 games), the final score of 12 - 8 was respectable and, if one or two hard games had gone our way, we could possibly have sneaked a victory.

So, as the season draws to a close, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the players who have turned out for the team. It has been a difficult season, with the side having to absorb the loss of several of last season's regular players. However we did succeed in finishing as runners—up in the East Midlands Zone, and hopefully the experience gained by the new players will be helpful next season.

Finally, I shall not be continuing as County Captain next year. I have always considered it an honour to be chosen to represent the County, and being captain was an extension of that. However I have several other calls on my time and I shall have to relinquish the captaincy.

If anyone is interested in taking over, I would be happy to discuss it with them. I feel, personally, that a non-playing captain is desirable, but I wouldn't wish to put off anyone who wants the chance to lead by example:

FIFTY YEARS ACO....

It would be inevitable that an eventual reference to the Nottingham International purnament of 1936 would be made, as all chessplayers in the county will be aware that its half-centenary is celebrated this year. And celebrate it we ought. The event was all originally to mark the Jubilee of the 1886 Nottingham Tournament, and took place at the University. The field of competitors was unprecedented in its strength, boasting prmer, present & future World Champions in Lasker, Capablanca, Euwe, Alekhine and by the title. There were other strong grandmasters such as Flohr, Bogoljubov, Vidmar and Tartakover; and a powerful British contingent headed by Alexander, Sir George Thomas and so on. The results obtained by the British players were disappointing, and they all ropped up the rest of the field.

Young players would perhaps be surprised to learn that thr first prize was the princely am of £200! In these days of weekend congresses, and prize money exceeding this figure, 200 seems, even in those days, a small sum for such effort.

Two of the lesser prizes were awarded interestingly, to Botvinnik (Brilliancy Prize) or his game against Tartakover, and the prize for the most wins was divided between Euwe, eshevsky and the usually super-solid Capablanca. Botvinnik & Capablanca tied for first lace with 10 points, but only 12 points separated the top eight grandmasters.

For a game from the Tornament, I could have selected the Brilliancy Prize, but I have aken the liberty of Indulging my own taste, and offer the win obtained as Black, by lekhine, against one of the most individualistic of all players — Tartakover. artakover never quite had enough of what it takes to make the absolute elite of the op three or four players in the world, but he was always dangerous, always innovative, nd played strong international chess until his death in 1954. As for Alekhine...! oxing fans often indulge their flights of fancy by picturing contests that could never ave taken place, such as Louis in his prime, versus Marciano or Clay, and speculating s to the result. I have often tried to imagine Alekhine at his peak, against the Fischer f 1970. What a treat that would have been...

Anyway, back to this game, which won a prize for the best game in Round 14. Tartakover ssays a typically unusual kind of Queen's Pawn Opening, and after one or two minor naccuracies on both sides, Tartakover underestimates the force of his opponents ing-side attack, and finds his King denuded of pawn protection. Alekhine concludes matter ith a characteristically sharp assault.

Incidentally, there is a recommendable paperback issue of the Tournament book (by over), containing all 105 master games with in-depth annotations.
